### More funding for Jordan sporting and community organisations

The latest round of the Palaszczuk Government's Gambling Community Benefit Fund is investing \$111,704 in the Jordan Electorate.

Member for Jordan, Charis Mullen said the Gambling Community Benefit Fund was Queensland's biggest one-off grants program delivering up to \$55 million each year for community groups.

"Sporting clubs and community-based organisations are the backbone of the Jordan Electorate and I am glad that we have this grants program to support them in their work, Ms Mullen said.

"In Jordan, Camira State School P&C Association will receive \$35,000 to refurbish the tuckshop," Ms Mullen said.

"The Springfield Camira Men's Shed will also receive \$11,729 to purchase woodworking equipment.

"These are community projects that might otherwise be out of reach without the assistance of the Gambling Community Benefit Fund," Ms Mullen said.

"I was so pleased to be able to connect our local community groups with representatives of the Gambling Community Benefit Fund at the recent Jordan Electorate Grants Information Evening.

"Having the opportunity to learn about what makes for a successful application should mean more groups have the confidence to apply for funding moving forward," Ms Mullen said.

"The Gambling Community Benefit Fund delivers grants for worthwhile projects from \$500 to \$35,000 with applications for round 101 now open," Ms Mullen said.

"If your community-based organisation has a project in mind, the Gambling Community Benefit Fund wants to hear about it."

Applications for round 101 close on May 31, 2019.
