## Funding Commitment for Flagstone Health Precinct

- If re-elected, the Miles Labor Government will begin planning for a mixed-use health precinct at Flagstone
- The precinct will have a health and wellness focus with opportunities to deliver ambulatory care and outpatient services, such as child health and community health
- Our commitment of \$500,000 for a Business Case will determine health service mix, site selection and opportunities to co-locate other agency services within the mixed-use health precinct at Flagstone.

State Member for Jordan, Charis Mullen has pledged \$500,000 to begin the planning for a new Mixed-Use Health Precinct in Flagstone.

With the Greater Flagstone region growing, there is an opportunity to provide early and needed health services for the Flagstone community.

A new Health Precinct in Flagstone could provide opportunities to deliver an ambulatory care / urgent care clinic as well as a range of allied health and community health services.

Children's Health Queensland currently supports a Child Health Clinic in Flagstone and Flagstone State School has been funded for a Health Practitioner support position through the Miles Government's \$502 million 'Putting Queensland Kids First' Strategy.

The Business Case to be completed in 2025 would determine the health service mix, finalise site selection and consider opportunities to co-locate other government agency services within the mixed-use health precinct in Flagstone.

"This is an important commitment in planning and progressing health services for the growing Greater Flagstone community, that will ultimately see 140,000 residents in the region over the next 20 years.
